7. How can perceptual load contribute to understanding the selection criteria in models of attention?
8. Briefly explain what performance on congruent and incongruent conditions of The Stroop Task suggest about attention.
9. Explain the Flicker Paradigm in terms of perceptual processing.
10. What is meant by the notion of an attentional bottleneck?
11. In terms of levels of processing, what is the main difference between early and late-selection?
12. Briefly, how can the Cocktail Party Effect be explained?
